Some Students will also be required to take MSC 206 Piano Class II (3 credits).

Please note that after declaring a Major in Music Education, each student must take applied lessons and participate in an ensemble every semester thereafter. For those who declare a Major in Music Education as a first semester freshman, the total number of credits for applied lessons will be 1.5 credits for 8 semesters and ensembles will be .5 credits for 8 semesters (12 credits of lessons and 4 credits of ensemble). If a student declares a Music Education Major after their freshmen year, the total number of credits for lessons and ensembles is reduced.

APPLIED LESSONS: Private study of the same instrument or voice is required each semester. There is an additional fee for these lessons. "Jury" will be expected each of these semesters.

PERFORMANCE ENSEMBLES: Participation in a large performing ensemble is required for four years of those semesters as a Music Education Major unless otherwise approved by the department.

SENIOR RECITAL: Music Education Majors are required to perform a senior recital during the fall semester of their senior year.

RECITAL ATTENDANCE:

All Music Education Majors are expected to attend college concerts and recitals.

The number of concerts (including mandatory attendance) will be determined by semester.
