APPLIED LESSONS: Private study of the same instrument, voice or composition is required for four years or those semesters as an MTP Major. All MTP Majors will perform a “jury” during the fall and spring semester of each year. There is an additional fee for these lessons.

PERFORMANCE ENSEMBLES: Participation in a large performing ensemble is required for four years of those semesters as an MTP Major unless otherwise approved by the department.

PIANO COMPETENCE: MTP Majors are expected to pass a piano proficiency examination by the end of their sophomore year,

SENIOR CAPSTONE: At the recommendation of the department, all MTP Majors will be required to propose, prepare and execute a capstone project during the spring semesters, senior year.

RECITAL ATTENDANCE:

All MTP Majors are expected to attend college concerts and recitals.

The number of concerts (including mandatory attendance) will be determined by semester.
